Women's Group Home Ribbon Cutting Ceremony January 27, 10:30 am

On Thursday, January 27, 2011 at 10:30, you are invited to a momentous occasion: the ribbon cutting for our new group home! This fabulous home will soon welcome 10 ladies. Each of the six Seedster bedrooms has an adjoining bath, a very welcome upgrade from the two small baths shared formerly by the seven women in the current home. There will be a gym, a large eat-in-kitchen, gracious living room, double laundry, large front porch that looks out over campus, a weekend relief parents bedroom and group home parent's quarters.

The home is a long time dream and a prayer answered. The cost of \$525,000 is being met in many ways. The Mustard Seed would like to express undying gratitude to those who gave financially. Lead gifts from the McAlister's Corporation, an anonymous donor and Trustmark Bank have helped kick off the capital campaign. The Women of Briarwood Presbyterian Church and a Rankin CC Leadership group held fundraisers dedicated to the financing of the building. St. Stephens Episcopal Church is the first of local churches to make a monthly pledge to the construction. The Mustard Seed Auxiliary donated the proceeds of the Tea to the group

It is with great joy that I bring thanks and blessings from the Mustard Seed. As President of the Mustard Seed Board of Trustees, I would like to report that many great things are happening here.

Thanks to a dedicated and caring staff and administration, each day, the mission of the Mustard Seed is carried out: "To provide a loving and protected Christian community and meaningful activities that allow the participants to fulfill the potential that God has created in them." While the staff and administration of the Mustard Seed help to carry out the mission, it is your gifts and donations to the Mustard Seed that help this to be a reality.

The Mustard Seed receives no state or federal funds as do many similar facilities that care for adults with developmental disabilities. Our belief is that we need freedom from government supervision in order to provide a high quality, faith-based community. That freedom comes with a price. Other similar institutions that accept government support receive reimbursements that vary from \$302.47 - \$327.00 per day/per client. At the Mustard Seed, we care for our

Seedsters in the residential program for a total of \$1240.00 per month or \$41.44 per day, with no taxpayer expense.

I guess the question is how do we do that? The answer is:

- God has richly blessed the Mustard Seed.
- Our employees believe strongly in our mission.
- Our parents pay a tuition that provides 1/4 of our budget.
- Our ceramic sales, produced by the Seedsters, provides 1/8 of our budget.
- The remainder comes from sources such as you: grants, gifts, church budgets and individuals who believe in our mission.

Our new Women's Group Home is nearing completion, a home for additional Seedsters that became a reality because of the generosity of our donors. We hope to soon address a new Men's Group Home. I invite you to visit the Mustard Seed. Come and see the new Women's Group Home and visit the Ceramics Gift Shop. Ask for a tour of the Mustard Seed and see and visit with those whom your donations help so very much.

Thank you for a wonderful 29 years, and may God bless us richly as we continue our mission.

This one event has benefited the Mustard Seed over the last two years and has provided over \$77,000 in funding for the Ladies Group Home - \$42,000 in 2010 alone.

In 2006, the Mustard Seed Gift gallery sold \$86,725 in ceramics; last year that figure skyrocketed to sales of \$152,000. We know we have a fine product. We believe the Seedsters' ceramics are twice blessed: one time when the gift is given to the recipient, and a second time as the monies return to the Mustard Seed.

All of the sales do return to the Mustard Seed where they provide \$1 for every \$8 needed to fund the program and care for our Seedsters. This is really quite and amazing process.

To sell that much ceramic art takes a lot of work both in the shop and keeping up with the inventory. The person that performs that important job for us is Joshua Zerbe, our Facilities Director.

In January of 2010, Joshua entered all inventory into a new computer system. The system can record each piece of pottery, the price, the amount, the number available and the number that has been sold. The system updates itself with each and every sale. At Mistletoe Marketplace this year we were able to chart which were our busiest times and plan for volunteers to help at those high traffic opportunities.

To have this information available at any time is an invaluable business tool. We will now be able to track your favorite pieces and make more of them to fill the demand. We can now plan early in the year just what we need to have available in the gallery.

The gift shop will soon move into the former women's home. The building will be retrofitted a little bit to make the building more suitable for a gallery. We expect to finish that project by spring of 2011. The new gallery will provide a larger space to show our ceramics and more room to showcase individual Seedsters' work.

We are so very grateful for your support. We know that our sales have increased because each of you has spread the news of our art. There is no copying at the Mustard Seed. Each piece is an original as conceived by a Seedster. The shop is open 9 – 4 Monday – Friday, except holidays, and we do open on some special Saturdays.

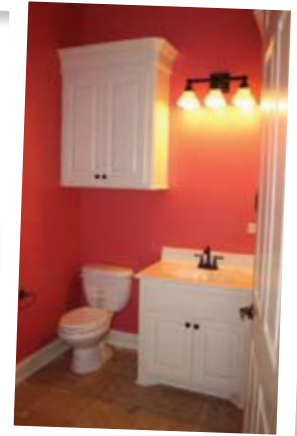

Joseph's story

Finally, I have a chance to tell Joseph's story at the Seed! What a difference a year makes! I have been sending epistles and tales about Joseph to all my friends and family. They have rejoiced with me over Joseph's new found interest in painting and have complimented my growing pottery collection. We have regaled all who will listen about Joseph's new life!

Joseph has Asperger's and so has had trouble all his life maintaining friendships. He has many learning disabilities. He is handsome and outgoing and eager to please. He loves routine and dislikes surprises. And, just like the rest of us, he yearns to be needed. At the Mustard Seed, he has found his niche. Joseph depends on the staff and his house parents to help him maintain a good attitude and work ethic. Guidance is needed throughout the day in relationships. He does not respond to sarcasm and the current "therapy". Joseph is his own man. He has dreams of being productive and helping others. The Mustard Seed is meeting his needs in every way.

Every few months of this first year, Joseph has been coming home to telling me he would like to go to college, learn car mechanics, or be a teacher. Like all young people, he has been pulled in many directions, not all of which are realistic. Each time I hear him tell me of his plans, I am a bit "unsettled," how-

ever, I continue to try to help him be realistic. A few weeks ago, we were in the doctor's office, and as is characteristic of Joseph, he began talking to several people in the waiting room with his big, booming voice. He told them of The Mustard Seed, how well he likes it, how he is an artist and paints ceramics, and then one man asked him. "How long do you think you will stay there?" And my Joseph said, "I plan to stay there for the rest of my life!" Now this just warmed my heart! I believe he has found his home!

You see, The Mustard Seed is "Home." I have never seen anything like it. There are no doctors, no therapists, no group therapy. The staff, who he sees everyday in the Activity Center where the painting takes place, are young. They are educated in different fields. They are enthusiastic. They are Christians who believe in what they are doing. And they are making a huge difference in the lives not only of the adults they serve, but in the lives of their clients' families as well. What a testimony!

I understood that one of the activities of the Mustard Seed is morning devotion. I never attended until recently, because I assumed that devotion consisted of everybody sitting in chairs, pretending to listen to a speaker who may or may not have a real lesson for the day, and then concluding with a prayer. At least, that's how all the devotionals were that I have ever attended. Was I evermore wrong! I happened in on devotion one day recently, and now I understand part of the secret of the Seed. Here, the Seedsters pray specifically for each other's needs. The atmosphere is loving, quiet, and reverent. Each person participates, and each person understands how important they are in God's plans. When I was called on to pray, I had no concerns, only praise! I must say, there was no pretense... this was real!

Another part of the Seed is the group home. Phyllis and Steve have made Joseph realize his importance in this world, and yet, they help him stay humble and are cultivating a servant attitude which we all need if we are to be effective in our work with others. Joseph loves Phyllis and tells me all about how Phyllis is so proud of him, and he loves to talk about the "dance" she does whenever he loses another pound (he has lost about 50 pounds since starting the Seed January 1, 2010). I was privileged to see this "dance" recently when I spent the night in the group home. Phyllis used humor and her dance to defuse an unpleasant situation, and immediately, we all nearly collapsed in laughter... and the situation which brought us to this was totally forgotten in that moment.

And, speaking of the 50 pound weight loss, we are thrilled as parents and Joseph is proud. Phyllis and Steve insist that each man do at least 45 minutes of exercise on the treadmill each weekday afternoon. As a nurse who believes in nutrition and exercise, this is the icing on the cake! I love it! Everyone should exercise! We do not place enough emphasis on this, and yet it can deter depression, improve self esteem, contribute to the growth of brain cells, contribute to weight loss, stabilize mood, and help control anger.

Hope this gives a little of the more human side of the Seed. We are proud to be parents of a Seedster!
